FROM THE PRESIDENT

NAICC Starts 2023 with Three Exciting Meetings

The 2023 NAICC Annual Meeting was held January 26-28th in beautiful downtown Nashville, Tennessee at the Nashville Omni. The site was only two blocks from the famed Broadway Street which housed live bands up and down the bustling sidewalks. Great food was in abundance all around the area and many landmarks were visited, including The Ryman Theater, Grand Ole Opry and The Jack Daniels Distillery. There was more to the Annual Meeting than sightseeing, the meeting was also educational for all categories of our membership.

NAICC celebrated its 45th anniversary in Nashville, and it was one for the record books. The AG PRO EXPO was sold out, and we even had to house one exhibiter in the main foyer. There were 827 attendees for the convention, which surpassed the old record of 772 in San Antonio in 2020. Each of the last 5 years the attendance has risen with the exception of 2021 when we were coming off of Covid and 538 attended in Orlando. 115 people attended the full-day Efficacy Research Training, 54 attended the GAIAC/NAICC Bio stimulants Workshop and 152 attended the GLP Training before the meeting.

NAICC began 2023 with a great start, including 115 new members already for this year. We have a lot of plans for 2023 and continued with the Focus on Consulting workshop, February 21-22, in Bloomington, MN. Next, it's on to Washington, DC where the Executive Board, the Governmental Affairs Committee members, and staff will canvas Capitol Hill and visit several Federal Agencies to discuss the Farm Bill as well as multiple regulations that are in the process of being implemented. We will conclude our trip with the 25th Annual Crawfish Boil on the hill, March 22. NAICC is hard at work for our members!

2023 NAICC AWARDS

AWARDS GIVEN TO OUTSTANDING NAICC MEMBERS

The Friday President's Luncheon at the NAICC in Nashville included several prestigious awards given to outstanding NAICC member recipients. The Consultant of the Year, established in 1993, went to William "Bill" Schaumburg, Tilth Agronomy, in Appleton, WI., while Service to Ag Award was bestowed upon Dr. Gary Hein, University of Nebraska. Special recognition went to Grady Coburn for his 45-year membership in NAICC. Clark Poppert and Grant McMillan both received honors for their enthusiastic top recruitment efforts.

With 19 years as an Independent Crop Consultant, Bill Schaumburg earned his degree at UW-Madison in Agronomy and Dairy Science. He is a certified Crop Advisor and past President of the Wisconsin Assoc. of Professional Ag Consultants. Bill has been an NAICC member since 2006 where he attended his first annual meeting in Atlanta. Tilth Agronomy employs 13 full time

consultants and 15 summer interns. Their main territory is Northeast Wisconsin. Originally, Bill grew up on a dairy farm in Seymore, WI. Bill is married to wife, Kelly, and they have four children. He also keeps busy watching his daughter's dance competitions, coaching his sons on the baseball diamond, and cheering the Packers, Badgers or Brewers. Congratulations Bill!

Dr. Gary Hein is a pioneer in research at the University of Nebraska. He received his undergraduate degree from Concordia College and both his masters in Entomology and Ph. D. from Iowa State. As Professor at University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Gary has been responsible for directing and managing the Doctor of Plant Health Program. His work has allowed practitioners to integrate broad training to diagnose and solve plant health problems and maximize economic, environmental and social sustainability. Gary worked closely with NAICC and the Foundation to develop this program. Professor Hein is retiring soon and should be proud of his accomplishments and dedication to Ag and to NAICC.

Dr. Grady and Ms. Barbara Coburn were invited to the stage to be recognized for forty-five years of NAICC membership. Grady served as Past President in 1986 and has since chaired and served on many committees. He has been a mentor to many other NAICC members and has been the only active member who retained membership in NAICC for 45 years. This is a remarkable milestone to be recognized.


