### HAPPENINGS ON THE HILL

As you notice there is a new name in the Happenings on the Hill byline this month as I take over the reins from Rick Kessler who ably reported on the ebbs and flows, and ups and downs, of Federal policy impacting NAICC members and their clients.

Unfortunately, there is no rest for the weary as we quickly move from the solid win of the reauthorization of the Pesticide Registration Improvement Act, (PRIA V) within the Omnibus Appropriations Bill at the end of 2022, to considering opportunities for pesticide related issues within a new Farm Bill.

The House Republican majority has named members to the House Committee on Agriculture with a mix of new and returning members.

The returning members of the Committee are Chairman G.T. Thompson, (PA-15), Austin Scott, (GA-8) Doug LaMalfa (CA-1), Mary Miller, (IL-15), Scott DesJarlais (TN-4), David Rouzer (NC-7), Trent Kelly (MS-1), Don Bacon (NE-2), Dusty Johnson (SD), Jim Baird (IN-4), Tracey Mann (KS-1), Barry Moore (AL-2), Kat Cammack (FL-3), Brad Finstad (MN-1) and Rick Crawford (AR-1)

New members of the Committee lead off with former Committee Chair Frank Lucas (OK-3), along with Mark Alford, (MO-4), Derrick Van Orden (WI-3), John Rose (TN-6), Ronny Jackson (TX-13), Lori Chavez-DeRemer (OR-5), Monica De La Cruz (TX-15), John Duarte (CA-13), Nick Langworthy (NY-23), Max Miller (OH-7), Marc Molinaro (NY-19), and Zack Nunn (IA-3).

The Democratic minority expects to have their members named by early February.

As Committee's on both sides of the Capitol undergo their formation, the Pesticide Policy Coalition (PPC) has also started its initial brainstorming

process to identify areas and ideas that could rise as policy priorities by PPC members. Early topics identified are:

- Enhancing the role of USDA Office of Pest Management Policy (OPMP),
- Enhancing the support and role of the EPA's FIFRA Interagency Work Group on endangered species,
- Trade issues, such as Codex engagement authorization and U.S. consideration of Codex MRLs,
- · Preemption,
- NPDES pesticide general permits exemption, and
- Incentives for the voluntary adoption of precision agriculture

Because every Farm Bill has a good deal of timing uncertainty, additional discussions by the PPC will occur on January 19, and thereafter over the few next weeks to begin to refine, add, and take away ideas hopefully resulting in policies that are concise, and doable within the current political setting.

I look forward to joining you in Nashville to discuss these topics and more. As NAICC members begin to think about the Farm Bill process, and in the development of its advocacy, remember that less is usually more. Aiming for a concise focus on the problem to be solved, through the simplest solution, and one that is easy to frame, is usually the best approach in capturing attention of hurried members and staff.
