HAPPENINGS ON THE HILL

Farm Bill

Last week, House Ag Committee Chair Thompson achieved his goal of passing a new Farm Bill through Committee by Memorial Day. The committee approved the bill, 33-21, after a feisty debate that started at 11 a.m. Thursday and didn't end until after midnight Friday. As predicted, the vote fell along partisan lines with only four Democrats voting for the measure; Don Davis of North Carolina, Yadira Caraveo of Colorado, Eric Sorensen of Illinois, and Sanford Bishop of Georgia.

The bill's path forward in the House is tenuous with Chairman Thompson admitting that a House floor vote may not come until September with precious floor time being allocated to the critical passage of the twelve FY '25 appropriation bills.

Should the bill make it across the House floor, its provisions on nutrition funding, limitation on the Secretary's use of Commodity Credit Corporation funds, and the removal of climate-smart constraints on conservation related Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) dollars make it dead on arrival in the Senate.

Saul Elbein, the agriculture and food reporter for the *Hill* does a good job in outlining concerns on the House Bill from both the right and the left as eyes now turn to the Senate.

Most observers expect the Senate will work to reverse many of the contentious House provisions leaving the looming question on where to find the dollars needed for increasing commodity reference prices and other funding needs.

One bright spot in the House bill is a refining of the NRCS TSP program which NAICC is on record as supporting. I expect the Senate to retain this provision in some form.

Regulatory Related Activities

Since the April newsletter, EPA has published a couple of important requests for comments.

NAICC will be submitting comments on the April 30 proposal to cancel all uses except one for acephate due to human health concerns. On Thursday May 16th the pesticide policy council met the registrant to provide its perspective on the proposal. You can read more about the proposal

NAICC will also submit comments on EPA's May 3rd notice on Bayer CropScience's application for a new product containing the currently registered active ingredient dicamba.

Wrapping up, I met with WSSA on May 8 to explore opportunities for greater collaboration between WSSA and NAICC. One identified immediate opportunity was an agreement that WSSA should work with NAICC on the Steve Hoffman led upcoming WI farm tour for EPA leadership and others.

Finally, the consensus by meeting participants on the May 9 EPA dialogue on ESA mitigation practices was that EPA has listened and will continue to listen to interest parties on providing greater grower flexibility in the adoption and implementation of mitigation practices.


